


# Making the most of your membership at Goldfields Library Agencies

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## Welcome!

Welcome to Goldfields Library Agencies! We have produced this booklet to help you make the most of your free library membership, and to let you know about all the wonderful resources and opportunities available from your local library agency.

Goldfields library agencies have a regularly updated collection of fiction, non-fiction and large print books for adults, picture books for children, junior fiction and young adult fiction. There are also DVDs, audiobooks and the latest magazines. Each agency has a self-loan area to borrow, reserve and return items. The agencies are attended by local staff and volunteers, and our librarians visit each agency once or twice a week to assist with any queries you may have.

Library users can browse in the agency or search the library catalogue online and reserve any of the 300,000 items across the entire Goldfields Libraries collection. Items can then be collected from your agency of choice.

A varied and exciting program of events takes place during the year, with programs such as children's Storytime sessions, digital literacy programs for adults, and author talks. 
Click on 'Catalogue' on the menu bar.



When prompted, enter your library card number (long number underneath the barcode on your library card), and your password.

You will be notified by SMS or email once the item arrives, and it will then be held for 10 days.

You can check the status of your reservation(s) by logging into your account (see next page on how to log in) and clicking on 'Pending reservations' on your dashboard.

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# Renewing borrowed items online

It is possible to renew the loan period of a borrowed item online, as long as it has not been reserved by another patron.






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## Library App

The library has an easy to use mobile app that allows you to browse the catalogue and reserve items, as well as renew items you already have on loan. It is available for Apple and Android.

<p>Download the free 'Spydus Mobile' app from Google Play (Android) or the App Store (Apple).</p>	
<p>Once installed, open the app and select 'Goldfields Libraries' as your library.</p>	
<p>Click on 'Login'.</p>	
<p>Enter your library card number (long number underneath barcode on your library card), and your password. Click on 'Please select a branch...' and select your local library or agency.</p>	
<p>Ensure 'Remember me' is turned on, and click 'Login'.</p>	
<p>Once logged in, you can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Click on 'My Account' to see items currently on loan and renew items.</li><li>• Click on 'Scan' to scan the barcode of any book, magazine or DVD when out and about to check if it is available at the library, and if it is, reserve it straight away!</li><li>• Click on 'Discover' to search our catalogue and reserve items.</li></ul>

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## eLibrary

The library has a fantastic range of resources available through our eLibrary, which can be accessed for FREE, 24/7 through our website! To start, go to [www.ncgrl.vic.gov.au/elibrary](http://www.ncgrl.vic.gov.au/elibrary). Note that some resources require you to be on a library computer or connected to our Wi-Fi, and some may require you to log in with your library card number and password. Here are just **some** of the fantastic resources available in our eLibrary:

eBooks, audiobooks and magazines are available for free on Borrowbox (eBooks, audiobooks), rbDigital (eBooks, audiobooks, magazines), uLibrary (audiobooks) and PressReader (magazines and newspapers from around the world in many languages). Apps are available for Apple and Android devices for all these platforms.

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## Home Library Service

Goldfields Libraries provide library services to individuals who are unable to visit the library. Staff and volunteers with the Home Library Service select library items that reflect the borrower's preferences, or items that the borrower has reserved, and deliver them to their home on a monthly basis.

The Home Library Service offers:

- Regular deliveries of fiction and non-fiction books, large print books, talking books, DVDs and magazines.
- Temporary deliveries after hospitalisation.

Who is eligible?

- People who have illnesses or disabilities which prevent them from accessing a library. These conditions may be temporary, recurring or permanent.
- People who are able to visit a library, but because of frailty or disability are unable to carry items home.
- People who live in residential establishments, such as nursing homes, hostels, supported accommodation houses, hospitals or prisons.
- People who are engaged in full time care for others.
- Young children who are in the care of any of the above groups.
